

Postdoctoral Research Policy Officer (100%)

1 - Position description

The Centre for Literary and Intermedial Crossings (CLIC) is looking for a full-time postdoctoral research policy officer (1.0 FTE).

As a Large Research Group (LRG) in the Faculty of Languages and Humanities of Vrije Universiteit Brussel (VUB), CLIC is hiring a senior Research Policy Officer to professionalise its research and project management. The Postdoctoral Research Policy Officer offers CLIC consultancy and policy support in order to enhance CLIC's research output and liaises between the research group's members and VUB's central services.

About the Centre for Literary and Intermedial Crossings (CLIC)

CLIC is a dynamic interdisciplinary research group that gathers over 60 researchers in the fields of literary studies, literary translation studies, theatre studies and narrative journalism studies. CLIC researchers engage with the study of literary, cultural, and linguistic crossings along three key conceptual axes: media, genres, and spaces. The group integrates different linguistic and cultural backgrounds and draws on a variety of methodologies ranging from intermediality research to cultural and postcolonial studies. Research within CLIC focusses, for instance, on image-text relations, documentary prose, transmedial narration and cross-cultural exchange in urban, multilingual, or transnational spaces.

Your tasks:

As CLIC's research policy officer you fulfil a coordinating function and collaborate closely with our more than 60 members (junior and senior researchers). You support the co-chairs of CLIC (Prof. Dr. Arvi Sepp and Prof. Dr. Janine Hauthal) and assist them in realizing the growth plan of the research group for the period 2024-2027. Taking initiative and being proactive are important skills within this position. Being a networker is also crucial. Under the co-chairs' guidance, your primary activity is to support CLIC members in their efforts to realize CLIC's projected output growth in terms of international publications, project applications and other strategic research domains.

Your responsibilities:

- You coordinate and support research proposals for funds such as ERC, MSCA and FWO;
- You offer tailor-made support to CLIC members of all seniority to increase and optimize the Centre's publication strategy and output (Web of Science);
- You help to develop an open-access publishing policy for CLIC;
- You help to actively scout international talent and facilitate international collaboration;
- You coordinate meetings and activities of the research group, such as seminars, lectures, workshops and research days;
- You stimulate and collaborate on the science dissemination and valorisation of the research group, both for scientific and broader audiences;
- You support the research group's financial management and administration and are closely involved in the daily operations at campus Etterbeek;
- You supervise and instruct the tasks and duties of CLIC's parttime Project Management Officer (0.5 FTE);
- You participate in CLIC meetings and research-related meetings at faculty and central university level.

This position opens avenues for different career paths, in academic research as well as in research management. Candidates may allocate up to 0.2 FTE of their position on own research in the field of literary studies. If you wish to do so, please submit a 3-year research plan (1 page) with your application.

The position can be shared on a part-time basis if several candidates indicate this as their preference.

2 - Profile

What do we expect from you?

Requirements:

- You are in possession of a PhD degree in a relevant field (or will have handed in your PhD by the start of the position at the latest);
- You have experience with scientific project management, including budget management, project planning, scientific valorisation;
- You are familiar with humanities and literary studies research;
- You have a well-developed international research network and are willing to expand existing research networks within CLIC;
- You have (near-)native English proficiency, with high proficiency in academic (written) English; proficiency in Dutch is a plus;
- You take initiative, are well-organised and a team player.

For this function, our Brussels Humanities, Sciences & Engineering Campus (Etterbeek) will serve as your home base.

3 - Working at VUB
